Dale is originally from Florida and Patty is from Detroit. The two met in Detroit where Dale was a regional manager for a nationwide restaurant chain. In 2000, the couple relocated to Cincinnati with Dale's job. After spending one year in Pleasant Ridge, the family of four moved to Springfield Pike because they like "good schools and old houses."

Dale and Patty have responded to the needs of the community. "We talked to other moms and dads at soccer games. People told us what they wanted. We perceived there to be a void to fill. And we wanted a place to go!" Dale laughs.

The nine-month renovation began as a family dream and "evolved to a Wyoming project," Dale says.

Dale explains the lengthy process of renovation, "It's a 2006 kitchen going into an 1890 building. There were no problems other than the scope of the project. It was very ambitious. It was very frustrating, but everyone was willing to help the project move forward. We hit a lot of challenges but Rod shepherded us through them."
